Chase County Commissioners

June 27, 2023

The regular meeting of the Chase County Commissioners was called to order at 8:00am on Tuesday, June 27, 2023 by Chairman Jacci Brown in the meeting room of the Chase County Courthouse. Also in attendance were commissioner Kurt Bernhardt, county clerk Wendy Moe, treasurer Rebecca Bernard, road secretary Jeni Lotspeich, Duane Dinnel, Terry Bilka, Diane Stamm and Scott Bussel. A copy of the agenda was kept current and available in the office of the county clerk, it was posted to the county website the day before the meeting. The agenda and open meetings act were posted.

Scott Bussel was present for open forum to discuss berms that have been built up along the edges of roads by the graders making it impossible to mow the ditches. He requested gravel be put on a couple roads in his area, "trucks turning" signs and also that noxious weeds in mag/gravel pits leased by the county be taken care of by the county.

Correspondence from the McCook Humane Society and Bridge of Hope was reviewed. Commissioner Brown asked that Bridge of Hope be put on the next agenda for discussion. Minutes from the Hospital and Community Center were also reviewed.

Surplus property was reviewed. Commissioner Brown moved to surplus a nonworking Hoover Vacuum (tag #310) and a computer stand (tag #270) from the Clerk's office to the trash. Motion seconded by Commissioner Bernhardt. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Bernhardt moved to dispose of a broken 3-hole punch (tag #308) from the Clerk's inventory and a nonworking Dell Computer Monitor (tag #604) from the election inventory to the trash. Motion seconded by Commissioner Brown. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Brown moved to transfer a metal coat rack stand (tag #285) from the Clerk's inventory to Building General inventory. Motion seconded by Commissioner Bernhardt. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Brown moved to surplus a nonworking Acer Laptop (tag #317) and printer stand (tag #328) from the Clerk's inventory and a nonworking Dell Precision T1600 (tag #339) from the Clerk of District Court inventory all to be trashed after hard drives are removed from computers. Motion seconded by Commissioner Bernhardt. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Bernhardt moved to surplus a computer tower (tag #1090), two monitors and one tower (tag #'s 1089, 1089, 605) and two monitors and one tower (tag #'s 1086, 1087, 1088) from the Assessor's office to be recycled with Applied Connective. Motion seconded by Commissioner Brown. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Bernhardt moved to dispose of five antique wooden barrel chairs (tag #'s 709-714), one globe office chair (tag #707) and one mid-back chair (tag #736) from the County Court's inventory to be listed for sale on Facebook. Motion seconded by Commissioner Brown. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Brown moved to surplus a compucessory shredder (tag #739), two wall clocks (tag #'s 716-717) and a sharp calculator (tag #720) from the County Court's inventory to be disposed of in the trash. Motion seconded by Commissioner Bernhardt. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Bernhardt moved to surplus a nonworking electric stapler (tag #735), an oak hall tree (tag #728) and a nonworking optical keyboard and mouse (tag #738) from the County Court's inventory to the trash. Motion seconded by Commissioner Brown. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Brown moved to surplus a nonworking two-hole punch (tag #722), a nonworking threehole punch (tag #721), an outdated HP Pavilion PC touch screen (tag #748) and a wireless mouse/keyboard (tag #758) from the County Court's inventory to the trash. Motion seconded by Commissioner Bernhardt. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Brown moved to transfer a desk riser (tag # 915) from the office of the County Court to the Assessor's office. Motion seconded by Commissioner Bernhardt. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Appointment of someone to take over the Fair Premium account tabled until next meeting.

Jon Cannon, Executive Director for Nebraska Association of County Officials, met with commissioners to give NACO and legislative updates.

At 9:00 Kylie Joyce with Region II Services met with commissioners to give annual updates for their Development Disabilities Services in Chase County and the surrounding area.

At 9:15 bids were open for the 911 Dispatch Console. Only one bid was received, from Prairie States Communications; the bid included two Scout EX Console tier 1 packages and necessary equipment for both consoles with one additional year of Scoutcare for a price of \$89,262.00. Bid was also submitted for Scoutcare for years two through five at a price of \$9,123.75 per year. Commissioner Bernhardt moved to accept the bid from Prairie States Communication for \$89,262.00. Motion seconded by Commissioner Brown. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried. Commissioners chose not to accept the bid for the additional Scoutcare coverage for years two through five.

Commissioner Bernhardt has been in touch with an individual who does concrete work, looking to remove and replace the current concrete steps and retaining walls at the front door of the courthouse. Due to the potential cost of the work, commissioners will gather informal bids before moving forward.

Commissioner Bernhardt moved to sign resolution #2023-10 to transfer budgeted funds in the amount of \$55,000 from the Ambulance to Ambulance Sinking fund. Motion seconded by Commissioner Brown. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried. A complete copy of the resolution is available for viewing in the office of the County Clerk.

At 9:30 Chairman Brown opened the public hearing for the new Nutrien Ag Facility in Lamar and stated that the hearing was open to receive public comment for the new Nutrien Ag Facility in Lamar. Planning/Zoning Administrator Jeni Lotspeich stated that the Zoning board approved the conditional use permit for the new Nutrien facility at their meeting last week and as such the public hearing is now open to receive comment. Terry Bilka stated that he thinks a fertilizer facility located at that end of the county is a service to the county.

With no further comments, at 9:45 Chairman Brown closed the public hearing. Commissioner Brown moved to grant the Conditional Use Permit, Application #1023 for Nutrien Ag Facility in Lamar. Motion seconded by Commissioner Bernhardt. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Assessor Tori Mueller joined the meeting to present her bid specs for 5-year Imagery Obliques. Commissioner Bernhardt moved to accept the bid specs as presented by Assessor Mueller and set bids to be opened on July 25 at 9:00am. Motion seconded by Commissioner Brown. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried. Commissioner Brown moved to designate the State Print Shop as the vendor for postcards as described in § 77-1633 (3g). Motion seconded by Commissioner Bernhardt. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Bernhardt made a motion to allow County Clerk to cancel the Empower Retirement plan. This was a plan previously used by the county but no longer has any county plan participants. Motion seconded by Commissioner Brown. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

Sheriff Mueller joined the meeting to request that commissioners consider paying for full family health insurance for Sheriff's Deputies as an added incentive to retain quality deputies. Other agencies are able to offer sign on and retention bonuses, Sheriff Mueller believes the added benefit of family health insurance would be an appropriate offering. Commissioner Brown moved to give the Sheriff's Deputies full family health insurance to be paid by the county to go into effect in October 2023. Motion seconded by Commissioner Bernhardt. Brown – yes; Bernhardt – yes. Motion carried.

With no further business to come before the board, Chairman Brown adjourned the meeting at 10:12am. Next regular meeting will be on July 11, 2023.
